

# Retired General Becomes Part of UML Staff at OSU

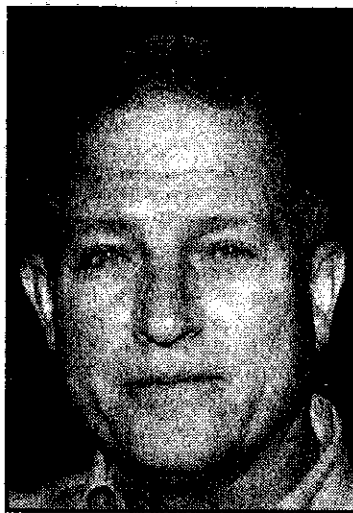
The OSU University Multispectral Laboratories is pleased to announce the addition of Major General Robert Al Goodbary, United States Army, Retired, to the OSU-UML staff.

According to Tim Reynolds, associate laboratory director for UML Operations, "General Goodbary will serve as the Director of Strategic Business Acquisition and will support the UML through Triton Scientific, LLC, a newly formed Oklahoma company."

Before his recent retirement from Oklahoma State University (OSU) General Goodbary served as Chief of Staff to the President and Chief Executive Officer at the University, and prior to that time served as Director of Military Relations at the university.

In that capacity he provided interface among government agencies, industry, university initiatives and was responsible for matching requirements with capabilities in the areas of research and development.

Through appointment by former Oklahoma Gov. Frank Keating, he also serves on the Board of Directors for the Oklahoma City National Memorial Institute for the Prevention of Terrorism. According to Reynolds, "The general's diversified background is exactly what we need to build the lab's customer portfolio,

and is vital in reaching our goals of fusing science, technology and operational tactics into capability-based products fully tested and certified for use by both warfighter and first responder communities."

Goodbary and his wife Shirley are OSU graduates and share a rich family history with the university. The general received a B.S. degree from the University in accounting and auditing prior to joining the United States Army and later obtained his master's in Public Administration from Central Michigan.

His military education includes the Command and

General Staff College and the National War College.

Prior to joining Oklahoma State University, Goodbary completed 31 years of active commissioned service in the United States Army where he held the following positions: deputy assistant secretary of defense/reserve affairs, deputy inspector general of the Army, deputy commanding general of the U.S. Army Aviation Center and School, commanding general of the Task Force Victory in Kuwait, and assistant division commander of the Third Infantry division.

Goodbary is a highly decorated general officer. He has led and coordinated activities at the highest levels within the Department of Defense and elsewhere within the executive branch of the government.

According to Reynolds, Goodbary is also well versed in the establishment and implementation of corporate priorities, strategic planning, reorganization for change, and customer/client service.

"We feel very fortunate to add someone of General Goodbary's background and experience to the UML team. He brings considerable management and military expertise and will be a significant resource for the UML," said Reynolds.
